There are no spelling rules to help you remember them!

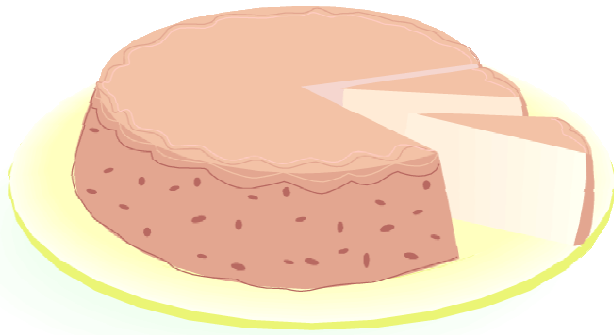


This **flower** is

bird of **peace**.

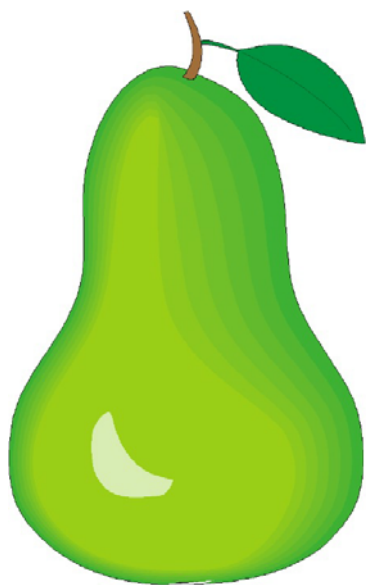


The **bear** is

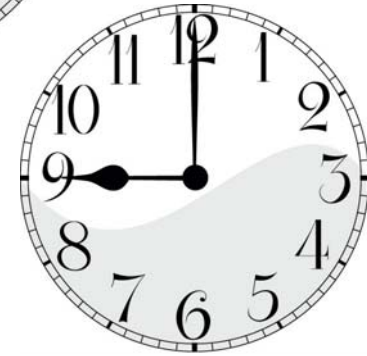
