Adjectives

Adjectives are words that describe nouns or pronouns.

E.g.



This butterfly is colourful.



These oranges are juicy.

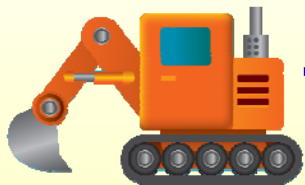
Adverbs

Adverbs are words that modify adjectives, verbs or other adverbs.

E.g.



The fish swam slowly.



The digger moved noisily.

Conjunctions

Conjunctions are words that link words, phrases or clauses together.

E.g.



Sam was excited when his dad caught a fish.



Snails and tortoises both move slowly.

Prepositions

Prepositions are words that link nouns, pronouns or phrases.

E.g. The sweets are in the basket.



The nurse is standing by the incubator.
